- ◆ See that my child goes to school regularly; arriving at school on time (8.40 - 8.50 am) wearing named school uniform, equipped and ready to benefit from the day at school.
- ◆ Let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect my child's work or behaviour.
- ◆ Support our school in maintaining high standards in all areas of my child's education.
- ◆ Support my child in own learning/homework and other opportunities for learning outside of school.
- ◆ Encourage good behaviour, politeness and respect for others and their property.
- ◆ Attend parent's evenings and discussions about my child's progress.
- ◆ Notify absence verbally to a member of staff or through a telephone call, on the first day, or a note.
- ◆ Park considerately outside school.
- ◆ Try to ensure family holidays are not taken during term time.
- ◆ Get to know about my child's life at the school.
